

Woolacombe in North Devon is named the greatest stretch of sands in the country by Tripadviser

A Devon beach has been named as one of the best in the world - and the best in England.

Woolacombe in North Devon is named at number 20 in the top 25 TripAdvisor Traveller's Choice awards for the world's top beaches in 2020.

The three-mile stretch of sands beats every beach in Cornwall and, for that matter, every beach in Australia. It is beaten only in the UK by a Scottish beach, Luskentyre on the Isle of Harris in the Outer Hebrides - which was ranked 13th.

Woolacombe has been the most Googled destination in the country over the early summer.

But it has also been lashed by storms along with the rest of the region. Video footage last month showed tides washing beach <u>huts out to sea during Storm Ellen.</u>

Topping the list was the stunning Baia do Sancho in Brazil, followed closely by Grace Bay Beach in Turks and Calcos and Playa Paraiso in Cuba.

The highest ranked Australian beach was Whitehaven Beach on the Whitsunday Islands in Queensland, which only managed 22nd.

With this in mind Discover Puerto Rico, the official tourism board for the destination. suggests five iconic books that transport readers to tropical Puerto Rico in their minds. From the colourful boroughs of San Juan, to the thriving LGBTQ+ scene, to the eclectic flavours of the local cuisine, to exploring Puerto Rico's pivotal history, book worms can discover Puerto Rico for themselves with these top reads...

Simone, Eduardo Lalo: Set around Río Piedras, Santurce and Old San Juan, Simone is an ode to San Juan's different boroughs. The story surrounds a middle-aged writerturned-professor who starts receiving messages from an unknown source. No matter where he goes or what busy street he decides to cross in San Juan, he'll always find a message. As the novel ensues, so does love for the city and also for the secret pursuer.

La Llamarada, Enrique Laguerre: One of Puerto Rico's most renowned authors, Laguerre writes about Puerto Rico's sugar industry and the way of life of rural-based Puerto Ricans during the first half of the 20th Century. Castillo Labadie, which Laguerre renames as Palacete Los Moreau, is used as a setting for several parts in the novel. Nowadays visitors can book a free tour of the chateau-esque mansion located in Moca.

Mundo Cruel, Luis Negrón: Cry., roar with laughter, and be deeply moved by this celebration of LGBTQ+ life in Santurce. This compilation of short stories showcases Santurce and Rio Piedras as truly as possible, with a poignant and hilarious sense of humour surrounding the LGBTQ+ scene that moves the reader emotionally and intellectually.

The House on the Lagoon, Rosario Ferré: Lean about the history of Puerto Rico through this riveting, multigenerational epic. The tale that unfolds in Ferré's writing has layers upon layers, exploring the nature of love, marriage, family, and primarily Puerto Rico itself. Centered on the life of a Puerto Rican living in Ponce, the book begins on July 4th, 1917, the day President Wilson signed the act granting Puerto Ricans American citizenship and the novel explores the history of a family whose secrets, conflicts and private mythologies add up to the larger story of a nation: Puerto Rico.

We Fed an Island, José Andrés: After Hurricane Maria left most of Puerto Rico without clean water, food or power, Chef José Andrés addressed the crisis the only way he knew how: by feeding people, one hot meal at a time. From serving sancocho at José Enrique's restaurant in San Juan to cooking huge local paellas that served thousands of people alone. We Fed an Island: The True Story of Rebuilding Puerto Rico, One Meal at a Time describes how a network of community kitchens activated real change and tells an extraordinary story of hope in the face of disaster.

Puerto Rico is reopening its beaches after a Covid drop

- Puerto Rico's beaches, casinos, gyms and theaters will reopen Sept. 12, according to an executive order signed by Gov. Wanda Vazquez.
- The order is in place until Oct. 2 when the situation will be re-evaluated.

The reopenings follow a recent drop in Covid-19 cases and deaths, according to the governor.

Visitors to public beaches and nature preserves must follow social distancing guidelines and masks must be worn when not in the water. However, competitive games such as volleyball and other sports activities are not allowed on the beaches.

Museums will operate at 50% capacity; hotel pools will be open at 25% capacity, and malls, retail stores and restaurants are limited to 50% capacity.

Bars, cafes and discos remain closed, although theaters, casinos and gyms can open at 25% capacity.

An island-wide curfew from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. remains in effect, although the lockdown will be lifted on Sundays.

Visitors to Puerto Rico must complete an online travel declaration (www.travelsafe.pr.gov), produce results of a negative Covid test taken no more than 72 hours prior to departure and self-quarantine at their own expense upon arrival for 14 days or the length of the visit, whichever is shorter.

Dr. Jose Rodriguez Orengo with the Puerto Rico Public Health Trust told the Associated Press that the situation had recently improved. "It's all going to depend on people's behavior to maintain that," he said.

According to the AP report, Vazquez said there were about 3,900 fewer Covid-19 cases since Aug. 22, compared with the nearly four weeks prior.

Many business owners applauded the changes, the report said. But some of the changes worried independent health experts, who are concerned about future Covid spikes.

The country paused its reopening strategy in late July after Covid cases rose.

EL YUNQUE - THE ONLY RAINFOREST IN THE U.S.



As the US marked 104 years since its National Park Service was founded in August, we place a spotlight on the natural gem of El Yunque, Puerto Rico, the only official rainforest in the US. El Yunque rainforest is home to stunning scenery, a diverse ecosystem and endless adventures for visitors to experience...

Natural Beauty

The El Yunque rainforest was revered as a sacred site for over a thousand years by the prehistoric Taino native people. They believed that Yuquiyú, the god of light and life, dwelled on Yuqué ("The White Land"), the cloud-covered peak now known as El Yunque. "Yuquiyú" also described a natural place so beautiful they could feel the presence of their god. Today, visitors looking for the wow-factor, can head to the Yokahú Observation Tower. At an elevation of 1,575 feet, the Tower offers panoramic views all the way to the ocean in the distance with the lush rainforest in the foreground.



Fascinating Plants & Wildlife

With an average rainfall of 120 inches a year, El Yunque provides the ultimate setting for hundreds of endemic plant and animal species, including the island's famous native coqui frog, a symbol of Puerto Rican culture. Coquis are onomatopoeically named after the very loud mating call which the males of two species, the common coqui and the upland coqui, make at night. Visitors can also learn about the 240 plant species endemic to the island, take in the park's pure air and enjoy some of the best birdwatching in Puerto Rico - hopefully catching sight of woodpeckers, green mangos, and the Puerto Rican parrot.

Adventure

One of the most popular things to do in El Yunque is hiking through the forest to one of the natural pools to cool off with a swim. Head over to La Coca trail and hike down to one of several ponds along the route for the perfect way to cool off. For fun in the form of a rope swing, choose El Angelito trail, where a 4km hike can end with a dive into its azure lagoon. There are plenty of additional options for trails with varying levels of difficulty throughout the park. Adrenaline-seekers can zipline through beautiful green canopies with Yunke Ziplining, or try horseback riding in the foothills of the rainforest with Hacienda Carabalí who offer horseback tours through the area for the whole family.



Local cuisine

Luquillo Kiosks are a great place to grab a bite to eat after a day of swimming and hiking in El Yunque where a collection of small, seaside, familyoperated eateries in the neighbouring town of Luquillo, which borders the park, serve a variety of Puerto Rican dishes. At the bottom of El Yunque
National Forest, El Verde BBQ offers a range of staple Puerto Rican dishes including slow-roasted chicken, yuca al mojo, baby back ribs, arroz con
gandules, and morcilla. Be sure to combine your meal with an ice-cold Medalla (a popular local beer) and mingle with the locals in the open-air patio
area.

Treehouses

To complete a truly wild experience in the rainforest - staying in a treehouse is a must. Yuquiyú is a rustic retreat in the foothills of El Yunque. A "glamping" destination that offers artisan-crafted treehouses each with a private balcony surrounded by a tropical garden and each treehouse boasts an iconic view of El Yunque Peak. Guests can drift off to sleep to the soundtrack of singing tree frogs and a cascading river and become truly at one with nature!



A beach holiday conjures up images of golden sands and turquoise waters - but if you're looking to indulge your gothic side, you may want to check out a black sand beach instead.

Think black and dark grey-hued shores, exotic vegetation, and dark ocean waters that can make for a supernatural-esque setting.

These eye-catching beaches are located in destinations with volcanic landscape. Usually, they're the result of volcanic materials being deposited into the sea, and being eroded and washed up on the shore forming the dark sands.

In some cases, it may even be a flow of lava that's reached the ocean and exploded before cooling, causing the black shingles that form the shore.

They're pretty incredible hotspots, and the best part is that you can go and see them for yourself (well, once travel re-opens properly).

The island of Vieques in Puerto Rico is fast becoming an astrotourism hotspot. With two-thirds of the island designated as a protected nature reserve, the low light pollution makes Vieques perfect for stargazing. Visitors to Vieques can take a Bio Bay Tour of Mosquito Bay, one of the world's five bioluminescent bays, where guides will highlight the constellations and planets. Three of the world's five bioluminescent bays are located in Puerto Rico and of these, Mosquito Bay was officially declared the brightest bioluminescent bay in the world by Guinness Book of World Records in 2006. The mesmerizing brightness of the bay is due to the remote location and abundant concentration of dinoflagellates. Night tours take place when the Moon isn't full to ensure the best conditions for seeing both the stars and waters glow as the night sky is reflected in the bioluminescent waters of the bay creating a truly spectacular natural light show. www.discoverpuertorico.com
